



Behaviour Management in Primary School (from the Primary Diary)

Managing student behaviour in Primary School years is about establishing a positive learning environment

Students are assisted to:

- recognise and regulate emotions.
- Establish positive relationships.
- Make responsible decisions.
- Work collaboratively.
- Respect others.

Behaviour by a student that compromises the Positive Learning Environment is categorised into

- Inappropriate behaviour (general).
- Unacceptable spontaneous behaviour.

Behaviour Management Framework

Behaviour Management Primary School (2-6)	
Step 1	
Establish a positive classroom environment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Establish classroom rules • Develop with class
Step 2	
Actions for inappropriate behaviour	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reminder of classroom rules. • Emotional regulation strategies employed
Step 3	
Actions for continued inappropriate behaviour	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Referral to Pastoral Care Coordinator • Use of restorative questioning and RULER strategies.
Step 4	
Actions for significant incident involving threatening or violent behaviour towards others.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Referral to Head of School
Step 5	
Actions for repeated significant incident involving threatening or violent behaviour towards others.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Removal of student from the group environment- in school supervision by Head of School • Parents informed • Individual Student Engagement Plan to be reviewed
