

## Basketball Program Scholarship Frequently Asked Questions

#### Who is eligible for the scholarship?

The athlete has to be of 'WABL Level' ability. That is defined as either:

- Already playing WABL Basketball (Division 1 Top age or Division 2 Bottom age)
- Judged to be of 'WABL Division 1 (Top Age) Level' ability by the Basketball Coordinator, who is running the Program or the trial selectors.

Specifically, if a player joins the program and they are not at 'WABL Level', but subsequently become of 'WABL Level', they do not qualify for the Scholarship.

#### What year level does the scholarship cover?

Basketball Scholarships are available for students from Year 7 – Year 10. (If the student enrols into the college in Year 10 they will only be eligible for a one year scholarship as the basketball program runs from Year 7-10)

#### Can new and existing students receive a basketball scholarship?

The Scholarship is available to students new to the College AND existing students as long as they qualify when they join the program.

### How will I receive the scholarship funds?

The Scholarship is delivered to the family as a credit against their school fees account.

#### What is the Scholarship Value?

The total value of the Scholarship is \$3,000. This is split over the first two years that the student is in the Basketball Program. I.e., \$1,500pa for 2 years.

# Does my son/daughter still qualify for a scholarship if the above criteria is met and they enrol part way through the year?

If a student joins the College or the Program part way through the year, then they still get the full \$1,500 in their first school year and \$1,500 in the second school year, i.e., no pro-rata will take place.

What happens if my son/daughter leave the school and they are on a basketball scholarship? If a student leaves the Program part-way during a school year, the Scholarship will be revoked on a pro-rata basis. E.g., if a student joins the program at the start of the year and receives a \$1,500 scholarship credit to the family's fee account, but subsequently leaves the program mid-year, half of that year's scholarship credit will be removed from the family's fee account.
